REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

The Blakeney Harbour Association (BHA) is a registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation with voting members (No. 1163228) established by its governing document (Constitution) dated 20 August 2015. The BHA evolved from the Blakeney Harbour Boatmen's Association whose members agreed to become a charity and whose assets were transferred to the BHA under a Deed of Transfer. The accounts are compliant with current statutory requirements in accordance with its Constitution.

STRUCTURE AND GOVERNANCE

Governing Document

The charity is governed by the provisions of its Constitution as detailed above.

Governing Body

Trustees are generally appointed in accordance with the Constitution and confirmed at the Annual General Meeting. Meetings are held regularly throughout the year as both planning and reviewing process for the activities of the charity.

Methods, policies and procedures for the recruitment, appointment and induction of new trustees. The Trustees are appointed to serve based on their skills, experience, enthusiasm and high ethical standards.

OBJECTIVES, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND PUBLIC BENEFIT

- The maintenance, improvement, protection, and conservation of Blakeney Harbour for the benefit of the public including all users of the Harbour and the residents of Blakeney, Morston, Stiffkey and Cley.
- 2) The advancement of education through the provision of advice and information to the users of Blakeney Harbour and the communities of Blakeney, Morston, Stiffkey and Cley relating to the Harbour and its surrounding areas.
- The promotion of public safety and the prevention and deterrence of crime in and around Blakeney Harbour.

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the general guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit when reviewing the charity's objectives.

REVIEW OF ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE FOR THE YEAR

During the period covered by this report the Association has focused its efforts on the following:

- Safety
- Education and communication
- Environmental work
- Sustainability

Safety

Blakeney point started to move position in the year, this focused the buoyage team to reposition Buoys 1,3 and 5 to assist with navigation in this area.

Minor changes were made within the harbour to the small channel markers leading to Cley and Blakeney to accommodate shifting sands and banks.

A replacement Drone was purchased with increased range which has enabled greater monitoring of the shifting tides and ground levels. Monthly inspections by air when the weather permits have proved useful and time saving.

The local aids to navigation under the management of Blakeney Harbour Association at Blakeney Harbour were inspected on 06/09/2023 by an Officer of Trinity House and found to be in good and efficient order.

Education and Communication

The Harbour Wardens have continued with their excellent work giving advice to members of the public. The notice boards have been updated to their usual high standards. We have produced a quarterly newsletter for member updates, along with regular email navigation information.

Environmental work

During the period being reported work has continued to clear abandoned craft from the Harbour along with re-uniting displaced boats with their owners via BHA mailouts. Work is underway to develop a technique for the safe disposal of abandoned boats.

Sustainability

Membership increased during the year. Our new membership database confirms the number of voting members has increased to 575.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Committee have reviewed the charities risk register and the significant risks that may impact the charity. Actions and safeguards to mitigate such risks are being taken where necessary.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Policy

The Associations accounts are produced on an accruals basis. Non-cash assets consist largely of buoys and associated ground tackle which are treated as revenue expenditure and written off on purchase / acquisition. As such the Association has no fixed assets and therefore no depreciation charges appear in the accounts.

Financial Performance

The attached statement of income and expenditure demonstrates in financial terms the activities of the charity for the period being reported. A deficit of (£10,290) was produced during the period on an income of £21,939 (of which £11 is restricted) and includes expected Gift Aid income from donations during the year of £3,388. The Majority of the expenditure during the year was the purchase of Bouy maintenance equipment to include chain and connections to be installed in the Harbour when appropriate. The remainder was devoted to meeting the Associations other objectives with Safety and Security rightly taking priority.

Reserves Policy

The BHA maintains its reserves in an interest-bearing account with its bankers. A minimum level for reserves has been set at £20,000 which is considered adequate to deal with any unexpected expenditure needs beyond those anticipated in the annual budget.

STATEMENTS OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and the United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

The law applicable to Charities in England and Wales requires Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of its Constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the accounts:

- 1. Income is brought into the accounts on an accruals basis.
- 2. Made up primarily of interest from cash in the Capital Account.
- 3. Gift Aid of £3,388 is due on 2023 donations and has been taken into income and reflected as a debtor in the assets and liabilities statement.
- 4. Expenditure is brought into the accounts on an accruals basis and has been allocated to groups reflecting the three objectives of the charity.
- 5. Safety and Security expenditure includes spending on buoys, ground tackle, weights and associated consumables.
- 6. H. Archer, a Trustee, is a director and shareholder of Archer Engineering Ltd which has during the year supplied fencing and equipment to erect an area at his premises to store BHA Buoyage and equipment at a cost of £597.18 Inc VAT. This has been invoiced to the charity at cost.
- 7. N. Thompson is a trustee and a director of coastal hire which hires Bouy maintenance vessels to the charity of which there are two invoices for the period of £540 and £180 Inc VAT.
- 8. Neil Thompson is a trustee and director of Neil Thompson Boats, they provided some notice board treatment coatings at a cost of £75.68 Inc VAT.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BLAKENEY HARBOUR ASSOCIATION
